- Transnational adoption from South Korea started right after the Korean War (1950-1953)

KOREA'S 'SHAME' AT BABY

- South Korea promised to stop transnartional adoption in 1996

  - South Korea continues overseas adoption agencies

- South Korea & adoptive countries face accusation wrong practices
  - · 2025
  - South Korea promised to stop adoption overseas

# INT'L ADOPTION FROM SOUTH KOREA: FEW FACTS







200 000~220 000 Korean adopted overseas (North America, West-Europe, Australia/NZ) in mainly White families.

#### main reasons:

Mixe-race, poverty, gender, divorce, unwed-mother, twins

#### main issues:


• cultural genocide


- forced assimilation/displacement, etc

# 2. ADOPTEE ARTIST COLLECTIVES



Reflection exercise that briefly explains the concept of synchronicity (without naming it).
Using simple examples to illustrate the concept, and emphasizing that it's about meaningful connections between events that seem unrelated.

#### A - Individual reflection exercise:

Encourage yourself to think about moments when something unexpected happened, you thought it's not commonplace, or there's no such thing as coincidence. Choose events which had deep meaning for you.

#### **B** - Share in small groups:

Gather students into small groups led by each guest and invite them to share their experiences of those singular events with each other. Discuss the similarities and differences in their experiences and reflect on what they've learned from these moments.

#### **C** - Group discussion:

Back to the large group. Invite few students to share the moments of synchronicity they discussed in small groups. Encourage discussion about how these experiences have influenced their perception of the world and their own lives as an artist, as a minority, as a human.

#### **D** - Conclusion:

Summary of the workshop's key points, and encourage students to continue paying attention to the signs of synchronicity in their daily lives. This workshop offers an interactive introduction to the concept of synchronicity, and allows students to explore their own experiences and perceptions in a short space of time confronting them to the collective and their pairs.
